A multimedia exhibition reframing the common tool in uncommon ways.

Julia LaBay's multimedia series explore the importance, symbolism and power of common hand tools. Through her *Tools Series* of monoprints, *Constructed Space Series* of wood sculpture, *Tool Impressions Series* of bas relief aluminum screening, *Printed Space Series* of abstract edifices and her *Retired Tools Series* of bronze and found objects, LaBay creates captivating compositions that present the viewer with a unique perspective on the symbolic role and usefulness of hand tools—comprising a curated collection of traditional and conceptual artworks.

As a sculptor, LaBay is acutely aware of the role of tools in creation; as an art and construction-skills educator, she works to remove the perceived exclusivity of construction tools and empower young women with access to this skillset. From these combined experiences, LaBay's artworks share the stories that tools hold.

Forward:

20 North Gallery is proud to present *Space & Construct(ion)*, a solo exhibition by Julia LaBay, displayed in an installation format echoing the repetitive nature that its depicted tools would convey if they were called into action. The artist states, "That rhythm is kind of symbolic to how the tool is being used in a space...if you're hammering, you're repeating that over and over again," a pattern visualized in both the individual artworks and the installation of the exhibition, itself.

Indeed, the concept of "the tool" is particularly significant to the history of 20 North Gallery. In 1993 the gallery was launched as a means to draw people (and potential real estate investors) back to a long-abandoned downtown—after gallery co-founder and owner Eric Hillenbrand had begun renovating several buildings in the neighborhood, including the one that housed the gallery. The literal "tools of the trade" he employed were not only essential components of his construction business, but embodiments of invention, engineering, imagination and, ultimately, works of art, in and of themselves.

With bold imagery and bright traditionally-feminine hues, Julia LaBay's tool-themed, multimedia series artworks display a playful dichotomy, while subtly underlining the power of tool-using to build engaging spaces in which we live and work. Her prints and sculptures succeed as stand-alone artworks, or as room-scale installations, a construct that serves to emphasize the universality of the common tool.

The idea of "the tool that does the work *is* the work of art" is a great concept, a great show.

Artist Biography

Julia LaBay received her B.F.A. in sculpture at The University of Toledo in 2012 and her M.F.A. from Bowling Green State University (Bowling Green, Ohio) in 2015. LaBay is an instructor and the 3D Technical Assistant at The University of Toledo Department of Art (Ohio) in addition to managing her own design company. She works with youth through Young Women of Toledo, teaching girls and young women how to use power tools. LaBay is also a past Curator for the Blair Museum of Lithophanes (Elmore, Ohio).

Her work has been shown regionally as well as nationally at galleries and museums including the Toledo Museum of Art (Ohio), Northern Kentucky University (Highland Heights, Kentucky), Marygrove College (Detroit, Michigan) and Manifest Gallery (Cincinnati, Ohio). LaBay has won several awards and grants for her arts practice, including a recent Accelerator Grant awarded through the Arts Commission (Toledo, Ohio). Additionally, LaBay recently was a visiting artist at Imagination Station in Toledo.

Artist Statement

My work reimagines everyday tools by shifting them into new, unexpected forms. I'm interested in how objects like hammers and pliers—often seen as symbols of strength or masculinity—can become soft, playful, or even tender. In some pieces, tools appear to melt or stretch; in others, they're built into bold, geometric shapes. These transformations invite viewers to see familiar objects in a new light.

My connection to tools began when I was young, building things with my father. Those early experiences taught me how powerful it can feel to make something with your hands. Today, I extend that feeling into my artwork and into my teaching, especially when working with young women+. I want people to see tools as something open and empowering, not intimidating or exclusive.

Across this series, I explore how tools carry stories of work, identity, and who gets to build. By changing their form, I hope to open up new possibilities for what these objects can mean and who they can belong to.








Feminine Drip; \$950


Cast aluminum, rubber and shelf;




Constructed Space #8; \$400








